- The Institution had already initiated ICT enabled teaching and learning in the campus.
- The teacher centric learning is gradually shifted to student centric learning
- The college provides syllabus and question bank to all students in the beginning of the each semester.
- Academic calendar is provided to the staff and students in the beginning of the academic year in which the rules and regulations, academic activities are given.
- The college is having well experienced lecturers to teach all the courses.
- The libraries are opened from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m., there is an open access system.
- The staff members are encouraged to participate in orientation, refresher courses, seminars, workshops and conferences.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Teachers are encouraged to assess the students continuously in the following way :

1. Formative assessment i.e. during the topic is taught through classroom assessment. Multiple choice questions, short answer questions, debates and group discussions.
2. Summation assessment i.e. at the end of the unit. The student knowledge and skills about the topic is tested through SAQ's, long answer questions and projects. This kind of assessment also gives the student's capacity of remembrance and retention of the knowledge he learned.

The good test takers are rewarded without hindering the poor test takers. The senior faculty contribute the question paper setting of the University, Autonomous Colleges and all the faculty participate in the valuation process.

6.3.4 Research and Development

- The college encourages staff and students to engage in research activities. Faculty are guided to approach UGC for financial assistance and in this year one minor project was sanctioned.
- Students are also made part of this activity for collecting data and analysis of it.
- The faculty are inspired to undertake quality-related research studies too.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

- There are two libraries in the college one is UG Library and another PG Library. There are more than 45,000 text books, a large number of reference books & journals are available.
- ICT facilities are available for the staff and students.
- Abundant infrastructure is available in the college for the class rooms, labs, toilets etc.
- All labs are fully equipped with UGC grants such as additional assistance, BSR etc.

6.3.6 Human Resource Management

- Recruitment of staff on merit basis, staff enrichment programmes are conducted for teaching and non teaching staff.
- The institution has dedicated and committed faculty. The staff members are busy with class work and research work. The non-teaching staff were busy with administrative and examination work.
- The institution also develops, revise and updates the competency of teachers through continuous monitoring and evaluation.
- Performance appraisal by the staff, appraisal by the students of the staff is done regularly.
- The faculty extend their services as resource persons, BOS members in various colleges, University Examination Observers, Examiners, Paper setters, Academic audit advisers etc.

- The recruitment of un-aided staff notification is given in the national and local news papers with eligibility, qualifications and date of interviews etc.
- The selection committee consists of President, Secretary & Correspondent, Principal, Subject Expert and concerned HOD.

- The science, commerce and management departments have established links with Industries for creating better teaching & learning environment.
- Faculty and students are given ample scope for study tour to the nearby industries for better exposure to close interaction.
- Creating more linkage with reputed industries for in-service training, internship, campus selection and study projects to make our students job-worthy and strengthening efforts to move towards better placement.
- To interact with the students to develop the entrepreneur skills of the students.

Strengths :

- The college is located one kilometre away from the heart of the town in a sprawling campus of 18 acres in an eco-friendly and free from pollution. The institution offers wide range of courses in regular, self financing and enrichment programs, some in the emerging areas having employment potential.
- The institution has well equipped ICT class rooms for usage of modern teaching methods and also getting access to live lectures of the eminent professors.
- Our college libraries are enriched with large number of books i.e. magazines, encyclopaedias, reference books, journals, back volumes, dissertations & Thesis, e-books & e-journals. The college provides internet & Xerox facility in the libraries.
- The college science laboratories are fully equipped.
- The college has two ICT based Seminar Halls with smart boards.
- The college has well equipped Gymnasium.

Weaknesses :

- In the higher education scenario of Andhra Pradesh, students in Arts and Science streams are declining as there is mushrooming of engineering colleges. It has to be underscored that the students strength in our college is slightly decreasing.
- Collaboration with the industries can further be improved to enhance the teaching & learning standards of the institution.
- Lack of communication skills and confidence among the rural students is amazed drawback for campus recruitments.
- It needs to be improved through the organization of personality development and skilled enrichment programs.
- Majority of the students are from rural background and underprivileged. Hence they are reluctant to join in English medium courses. Some programs need revision to keep up with changes in the field and improve course sequencing to help student progression.

Opportunities :

- Strengthening of alumni network and linkages with industries will create more possibilities for increasing the percentage of campus placement.
- The college has good scope for consultancy services due to its modern laboratories and allied infrastructure.
- The institution has good potentialities to make industrial collaboration in teaching and training of students in science, commerce and business management streams.
- The institution has ample scope to recognize it as the centre of research.


Challenges (Threats) :

- Unfavourable supply – demand situation of qualified and quality faculty leading to un-healthy condition among colleges for the limited number of available faculty.
- Un-healthy competition from the corporate institutions around in UG level admissions.
- Recruitment of teaching and non-teaching staff in the place of retired staff.
- Providing better facilities and quality staff with existing low fee structure is a big challenge to the management. Integrating teaching with research at under graduate level is another challenge.
- Commercialization of education challenges the service motto of the institution.
- Imparting training in communication and computer skills is inevitable as most of the students are from rural and backward areas.


